**Read Jeremiah 33:1-3...** Do you ever ask questions when going over the scouting report? Do you ever question God? What does He want us to do when we have questions?

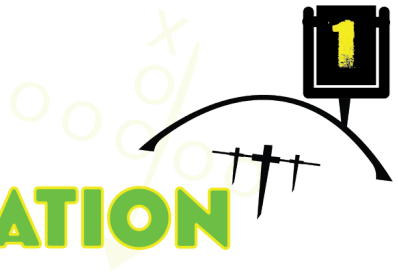


**Scouting reports help us make plans for opponents.**
